# Summer Reading English III CP

## Novel: Little Women Louisa May Alcott

In order to be prepared for the fun adventures of English and to reinforce important concepts and analytical skills, you will be reading a story focused on the role of women in society and the effects of social expectations on the trajectory of their lives.

\*\*Remember that your reading assignment should be completed and posted into your Google Classroom **prior** to the first day of school. This counts as the first **test grade** of the year. When you return to school you will have an in-class written assignment to further check your understanding of the novel.

As you read the novel you will keep a journal that shows how you are interacting with the text. This journal should be posted into the GoogleDoc template that you will have in your Google Classroom. Assignment is due BEFORE the first day of school.

#### Instructions:


- For every **5 chapters** of reading, you will write a journal entry between **7-10 sentences**. You will choose a direct quote/passage from the text and write about its overall significance, deeper meaning, and/or how you relate to it. (Your passage does not count as part of your sentences)
- You should have a **total of 8-10** journal entries.
- Ideas for analyses you may choose to include:
  - Hidden meanings
  - o Metaphors, allegory, similes, allusions, morals etc.
- Ideas for experiences you may choose to relate:
  - o Memories
  - Other literary works
  - Real-life scenarios
  - Ethical/ social dilemmas
  - Historical context

# \*\* Your entry should have:

- 1. A date
- 2. A citation/passage that is part of a quote sandwich. Make sure you are introducing the quote AND explaining its significance.
- 3. An analytical response of 7 to 10 sentences
- 4. Writing should be in MLA format (Times New Roman, 12 pt font, double spaced).

Sample Response:

There are so many nuances to the role of women and the varied personalities and perspectives that Alcott introduced through her characters.
