In comprehensive studies conducted on summer break, it was determined that children in 3rd to 5th grades, who did no summer work, lost, on average, about 20% of their school-year gains in reading and 27 percent of their school-year gains in math during summer break. (Scholastic.com)

What can we do about this significant learning loss? There are actually many ways you can keep your child engaged with learning this summer. Encourage your child to:

- Help solve real world math problems, such as, determining total cost, change, elapsed time, practice with multiplying and division.
- Write: Keep a journal, make your grocery list, write letters to relatives, make a scrapbook of summer adventures and add captions to the pictures, etc.
- Read: at home, outside, at the library, to siblings or stuffed animals, to family
